### Absalom Caudle, Jr.

Absalom Caudle, Jr. was born on September 15, 18001, in Anson County, NC. He was the son of Absalom Caudle Sr. [451] and Elizabeth Maness Caudle [452].

He died August 3, 1846, in Decatur County, TN, reportedly from being kicked by a horse.

On January 30, 1818, Absalom Caudle acquired property on Lanes Creek from William Pool2.

In about 1821, he married Mary B. Haney [457] in Anson County, NC. Mary was the daughter of Hezekiah Haney [12423] and was born about 1804. She died about 1848 in Decatur County, TN.

Absalom's sister, Elizabeth Caudle [9950], married Mary's brother Hardy Haney [14386]. They had at least eight children as shown in the 1850 census of Henderson County, Tennessee<sup>4</sup>. They indicate that all their children, except William, were born in North Carolina. Based upon this data, we deduce that Hardy and Elizabeth relocated to Tennessee in 1844.

### Removing to Tennessee

Absalom Caudle sold land located on Lanes Creek in Anson County on December 2, 1830, to Elias Preslar<sup>5</sup>. Without confirmation through examination of the original deed documents, I'll assume this is the same property he acquired from William Pool in 1818. Knowing that Absalom's son William Andrew Caudle was born in Decatur County, Tennessee in 1833, we can document that Absalom moved to Tennessee between early 1831 and 1833.

In a land warrant dated April 1, 1849, Absalom Caudel is granted 200 acres of land in Range 7, Section 8, of Henderson County, Tennessee<sup>6</sup>. Warrant #7298 is described by a survey dated April 30, 1834. The warrant was entered September 1, 1848. Understanding that Absalom died three years prior to recordation, it is presumed that the family is entering the grant for his property, surveyed in 1834, that they can complete the disposition of his property.

North Carolina and Tennessee, Early Land Records, 1753-1931. Warrant #7298, April 1, 1849.

By 1840, Absalom Caudle resides in Henderson County, Tennessee, and appears within the census on  $p.362^7$ . His father-in-law, Hezekiah Haney appears upon this same census enumerated five households after Absalom. His name was recorded as Ezekiah Haney on this census.

In 1915, at a time when Jesse Benton Caudle was filing his Civil War Pension Application, he describes that his parents' house was, "A log house two stories high, four rooms, two above and two below and boy's house - kitchen and dining room separated from the main house." He further indicated that he was too young to remember much of his parents because he was quite young at the time of death.

We know from multiple sources that Absalom's property was located near Scotts Hill, Tennessee (35°31'15.4"N 88°15'05.7"W).

#### Life after Death

After Absalom's death in 1846, and Mary's death in 1848, the children dispersed to live with different families.

Absalom's oldest son, Andrew J. Caudle, can be located in Decatur County, TN, in the 1850 census (Household #27)8. Residing in his household are his four children and his little brother, Absalom W. Caudle. In the enumeration next to Andrew, (Household #26), are found Ben Taylor and Frances Taylor. Frances Taylor is Absalom's daughter --she has taken in her younger sister Malinda C. Caudle. Within Andrews household resides a Martha Caudle, age 10, which could possibly be his little sister Martha. The middle initial 'S' creates questions, however, her age is correct.

Andrews's sister, Elizabeth Caudle, married Issac Rice. At the time of the 1850 census, they reside in household #3, 24 enumerations from Andrew, within Decatur County. In their household is a Martha L. Caudle, age  $12^9$ . This presents a bit of a problem because we now have two strong possibilities for Martha's location --- one with her brother, the other with her sister. The middle is initial is correct on one of the listings, yet the age is incorrect. I'm willing to consider that Martha was enumerated twice.

Jesse Benton Caudle and sister Tennessee are residing with Ebenezer Lee and Sarah Lee in Decatur County, Tennessee (Household  $#7)^{10}$ .

Malakiah R. Caudle, Absalom's son and eighth born, resides with James & Martha Plunckit, in household #31 four enumerations from big brother Andrew.

Elizabeth Caudle, Absalom's daughter and seventh born, resides with William and Susanna Bartholomew in nearby Henderson County, household #8711.
