 Know Ye That We for and in consideration of the sum of fifty  
 Shillings for every hundred Aeres hereby granted paid into Our Treasury by  
 Thomas Pickett have given and granted and by these presents do give and  
 grant unto the said Thomas Pickett a Tract of Land containing Two  
 hundred Aeres lying and being in Our County of Watham on the South  
 Spring of Price Creek Beginning in the County Line at a Red Oak  
 running South one hundred and seventy four poles to a Post Oak thence  
 East eighty eight poles to a Gum at the mouth of a Branch thence up  
 the Various Courses of said Branch one hundred poles to a White Oak  
 thence up North two hundred and twenty poles to a Post Oak in County  
 Line thence West one hundred and seventy three poles to the Beginning  
 as by the plat hereunto annexed doth appear together with all Woods  
 Waters Mines Minerals Hereditaments and Appurtenances to the said  
 Land belonging or Appertaining To hold to the said Thomas Pickett his  
 Heirs and Assigns forever. Yielding and paying to us such Sums of money  
 yearly or otherwise as Our General Assembly from Time to Time may  
 direct Provided Always that the said Thomas Pickett shall  
 shall cause this grant to be Registered in the Registers Office of Our  
 said County of Watham within Twelve Months from the date hereof other  
 wise the same shall be Void and of no Effect

 Caudle have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto  
 the said Abraham Caudle a Tract of Land containing four hundred Aeres lying  
 and being in Our County of Watham on Little Beaver Creek Beginning at  
 a White Oak near Bishannons Spring running West three hundred and fifty  
 six poles to a Pine thence North two hundred ten and a half pole to a Pine  
 thence East three hundred and fifty six poles to a Stake thence South two  
 hundred ten and a half poles to the first Station as by the plat hereunto an-  
 nexed doth appear together with all Woods Waters Mines Minerals He-  
 reditaments and Appurtenances to the said Land belonging or Appertaining  
 To hold to the said Abraham Caudle his Heirs and Assigns forever. Yielding and  
 paying to us such Sums of Money yearly or otherwise as Our General Assembly  
 from Time to Time may direct Provided Always that the said
